

INTRODUCED BY ALDERMEN BRUNNER, SHELTON AND OPPENHEIM

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING BENEFITS FOR CERTAIN EMPLOYEES UNDER THE MISSOURI LOCAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT SYSTEM; AUTHORIZING DEDUCTIONS FROM WAGES AND SALARIES OF THOSE EMPLOYEES; AND AUTHORIZING PAYMENT OF EMPLOYER CONTRIBUTIONS; PROVIDING FOR THE CURRENT MAINTENANCE OF THIS CODE; PROVIDING THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ORDINANCE AND PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF ALL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF BRENTWOOD, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

The City of Brentwood, Missouri is a "political Subdivision" as defined in Sections 70.600 through 70.760 RSMo. Supp. 1967 and hereby elects to have covered by the Missouri Local Government Employees Retirement System all its eligible employees in the following classes:

Present and Future General Employees, including all elected officials eligible for coverage under said Retirement System but excluding those policemen and firemen covered by the City of Brentwood's Police and Firemen's Retirement Pension Fund.

The City hereby elected that 100% of prior employment be considered for prior service credit in computing benefits and contributions to the system.

Be It Further Ordained, the City Administrator-City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to deduct from the wages and salaries of each employee member the member contributions required by Section 70.705 RSMo. Supp. 1967, and to promptly remit the deductions to the Retirement System, together with the employer contributions required by Section 70.370 RXMo. Supp. 1967.

In conformity with the provisions of said Code, the City Clerk shall cause appropriate copies to be made hereof and shall insert such copies in each edition of said Code.

All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after April 1, 1969.
