
THE UNION OF THE STATE

The book follows the members of The State from their time as classmates at New York University in the late 1980s to their quick ascent to fame via their three-season, sketch-comedy TV series on MTV and through post-MTV projects. It also includes histories of the movie-turned-Netflix-series, "Wet Hot American Summer;" the Comedy Central hit, "Reno 911!;" and cult favorite comedy show/series, Stella.

The projects of The State leave no degree of separation between them and nearly everyone working in comedy today, such as, Amy Poehler, Andy Samberg, Keegan-Michael Key, Jordan Peele, and Natasha Leggero. The book features rare photos and illustrations from the troupe's twenty-five-year history.

"The members of The State are my heroes, my peers and my friends. Individually and collectively they are responsible for an impressively large percentage of everything funny that currently exists in the world. For comedy nerds like me, it's essential reading," says "Weird Al" Yankovic.
